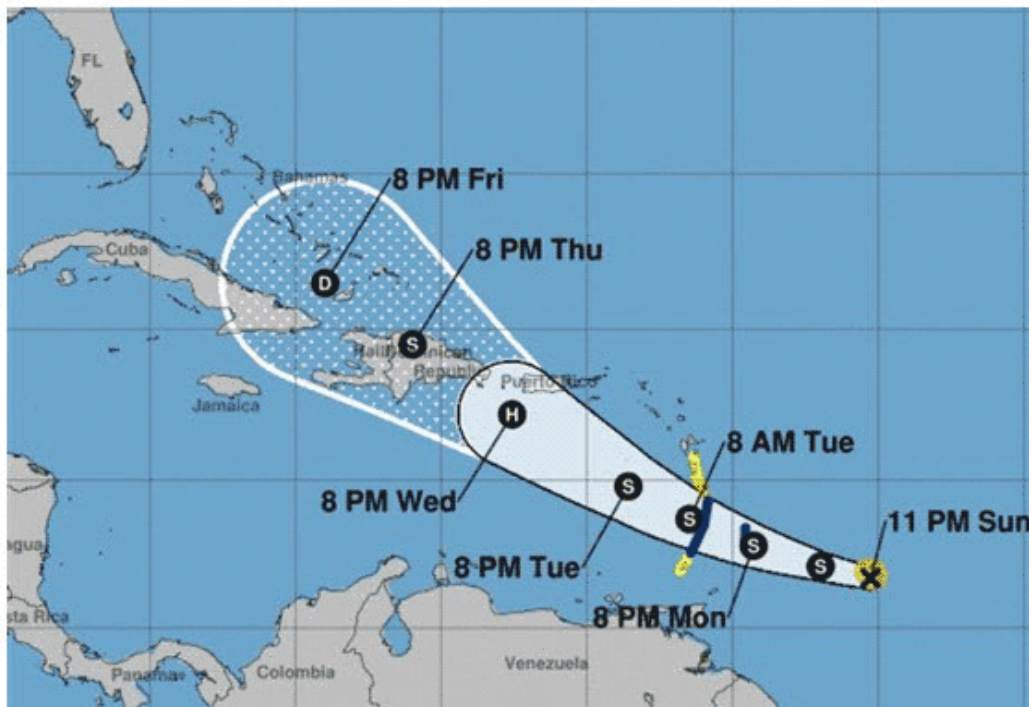

## Tropical Storm Dorian expected to strengthen over the next couple of days, possibly becoming a hurricane by Tuesday evening or early Wednesday

Dorian is approximately 200 miles southeast of Barbados, moving in a westerly direction at 14 mph. It will bring significant rain and storm surges to the Lesser Antilles and Puerto Rico. The storm has sustained winds of over 60 mph, which extend over 45 miles from its center. Sedgwick would like to ensure our clients know that we are here to help.
